Ayn Rand Institute Anthem Essay Contest

This contest is available for 8th-12th grade students. Applicants must select one of the three topics and write an essay between 600 and 1,200 words based on Ayn Rand's "Anthem" Essays will be judged on style and content. Award: First place: \$2,000; Second place: \$250 and Third place: \$100.

AMVETS National Scholarships

AMVETS National Scholarships are available to veterans, service members, and families that lack the financial means to further their education. All scholarships are awarded based on financial need, academic promise, and merit. Applicants must be enrolled or accepted for enrollment to an eligible program, be a United States citizen, must provide evidence of active duty status or veteran status having served honorably and must not be in default on a federal student loan. AMVETS NSF offers several scholarships:

- **Veterans, Active Duty, Guard/Reserves (other than dishonorable):** Three scholarships of \$4,000, (\$1,000 awarded per year). Acceptance letter, a Student Aid Report, and an essay (between 400 to 500 words) are required.
- **Spouses Scholarship:** For the spouse of a United States veteran, active duty, guard/reserves. Applicant must be a graduating high school senior entering at the college freshman level in the upcoming fall semester, demonstrate an academic promise and financial need. One scholarship of \$4,000 (\$1,000 awarded per year). Acceptance letter, a Student Aid Report, and an essay (between 400 to 500 words) are required.
- **Children/Grandchildren of Veterans, Active Duty, Guard, and Reserves:** Six scholarships of \$4,000 (\$1,000 awarded annually per year over four years) for students who are currently high school seniors: AMVETS Scholarship and JROTC Scholarship. High school or college/university transcripts, a copy of the applicant's Student Aid Report (SAR) and acceptance letter stating student status from an accredited program are required. The applicant must submit an essay (no more than 500 words).
- **JROTC High School Senior Scholarship:** One (1) \$1,000 scholarship awarded to one (1) JROTC Senior Cadet per year.

There are also two Memorial Scholarships:

- **The Dr. Aurelio M. Caccamo Family Foundation Memorial Scholarship:** Two (2) scholarships of \$12,000, (\$3,000 awarded per year).
- **The Donald Montana Distinguished Military Veteran Memorial Scholarship:** One (1) scholarship of \$4,000, (\$1,000 awarded per year).

Awards: Sixteen partial college scholarships of \$4,000 each and winners will receive second year scholarships of the same amount, contingent upon satisfactory academic accomplishment. Air Force Association Scholarships

AFA presents scholarships and grants to Air Force active duty, Air National Guard and Air Force Reserve members and their dependents as:

- **Mike & Gail Donley Spouse Scholarship**



The scholarship program is designed to encourage Air Force spouses worldwide to pursue associate, bachelor, or graduate/postgraduate degrees. Applicant must be a spouse of Air Force Active Duty, Air National Guard, Air Force Reserve or Department of the Air Force civilian employee to be eligible. Spouses who are themselves Air Force personnel, or in ROTC, are not eligible. Applicants must have a minimum 3.5 cumulative GPA, be in a degree program or intend to enroll in one and must submit an essay of no greater than 600 words describing their academic and career goals and the motivation that led them to this decision and discuss how Air Force involvement or local community activities in which the applicant is involved will enhance their goals. Provide two signed letters of recommendation from professors, employers, or volunteer organizations. Award: Two scholarships (\$2,500 each) will be awarded based on the quality and merit of applications. The scholarship is a one-time award (nonrenewable).

- **Colonel Aaron Burgstein Memorial Scholarship**

The scholarship was established for minor dependents of (officer or enlisted) active duty, retired, or prior service members of all branches, reservists or National Guard members who are/will be pursuing a two-year or four-year degree at an accredited college/university. One letter of recommendation and a 600 word essay (approximately two pages typed and double spaced) describing the applicant's academic and personal achievements and goals are required. Award: \$1,000. Award is non-renewable.

- **Captain Jodi Callahan Memorial Scholarship**

This scholarship is in memory of Captain Jodi Callahan who was an AFA Under-Forty National Director and a Trustee of the former Aerospace Education Foundation and provides \$1,000 to USAF/USSF Active Duty, Guard, or Reserve personnel pursuing a master's degree in a non-technical field.

- **Lt Col Romeo - Josephine Bass Ferretti Scholarship**

The scholarship was established for minor dependents of active duty or retired Air Force, Air Force Reserve or Air National Guard Enlisted Airmen. Applicants must be pursuing an undergraduate degree in science, technology, engineering, or math (STEM). The applicant should submit an essay no greater than 600 words describing their academic achievements and goals. One letter of recommendation and proof of acceptance into an accredited college/university indicating their intended major are required. The recipient will be selected by the committee based upon high academic achievement, good character, and financial need. Award: One scholarship of \$5,000. All applications are to be filled out using AFA's online application service, SmarterSelect.

Air Force Aid Society (AFAS) Grants and Merit Scholarship

The Air Force Aid Society (AFAS) offers need-based grants through the General Henry H. Arnold Education Grant Program and Merit Scholarships. **The Arnold Education Grant** is need based and is awarded to eligible Air Force dependents each year. The General Arnold Education Grant program is the centerpiece of AFAS education support. The application process for the Arnold Education Grant serves as the platform for other key education support opportunities at the Society. For the scholarship, applicants will be evaluated based on cumulative GPA, high school transcripts and an essay written on a specified topic. Each grant awarded carries the name of an individual or organization exemplifying service to the USAF. AFAS also offers Merit Scholarships awarded each year to ten incoming freshmen students who demonstrate outstanding academic potential. Consideration for the AFAS Merit Scholarship requires completion of the Arnold Education Grant application, but a student can be awarded a Merit Scholarship without receiving the needs-based Arnold

Education Grant. Awards: Arnold Education Grants ranges from \$500 to \$4,000 with the highest amounts going to the students with greatest demonstrated need. AFAS Merit scholarship: a minimum of 10 scholarships of \$5,000 each.

2021 Congressional Black Caucus Foundation Scholarships

Each year, CBCF in partnership with CBC Spouses awards more than 300 scholarships to students who demonstrate leadership ability through exemplary community service and academic talent, supporting current or upcoming college students across a variety of disciplines. For the General application, applicants need to submit a resume (3 pages maximum), two letters of recommendation, and a recent photograph suitable for publication. Selected applicants will be constituents of a CBC member's district. Applicants may apply for all available scholarship opportunities. Available scholarships are:

- **HBCU NREI Scholarship**

The CBC Foundation's National Racial Equity Initiative for Social Justice (NREI) HBCU Social Justice Scholarships were created to encourage and recognize necessary student exposure, experience, and engagement in organizing, political mobilization, and civic participation aimed at advancing equity, freedom, and justice for all, especially the Black community and racial minorities. The funds will be disbursed on an annual basis to undergraduate students attending Historically Black Colleges or Universities with demonstrated experience in social justice, student activism, and/or community service.

- **CBC Spouses Essay Contest**

Each year, CBCF invites qualified African American and Black junior and senior high school students from the districts of Congressional Black Caucus (CBC) Members to participate in the Essay Contest and Issue Forum. Students are presented with a topic that embodies some of our communities' most pressing issues. Awards: First place winner will receive \$1,500; second place will receive \$1,000, and third place will receive \$750. Winners and their families are also invited to Washington, DC in September to accept their awards.

- **CBC Spouses Performing and Visual Arts Scholarship**

- ✓ CBC Spouses Performing Arts Scholarship:

This scholarship was established in honor of the late Curtis Mayfield to ensure that African American or Black students pursuing a degree in the performing arts receive financial assistance. Performing arts include theater, drama, comedy, music, dance, opera, marching bands, etc. Awards: \$3,000 per student for up to 10 students.

- ✓ CBC Spouses Visual Arts Scholarships:

This scholarship was established to provide financial assistance to African American or Black students pursuing a degree in the visual arts. Visual arts include architecture, ceramics, drawing, fashion, graphic design, illustration, interior design, painting, photography, sketching, video production, etc. Awards: \$3,000 per student for up to 10 students.

- **CBC Spouses Education Scholarship**

This opportunity awards scholarships to academically talented and highly motivated African American or Black students pursuing an undergraduate, graduate, or doctoral degrees in a variety of fields as political science, public policy, public administration, international relations, public affairs, mass communications, African American studies, legislative affairs, pre-law, criminal justice, American history and/or Juris Doctor. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent U.S. residents. Qualified applicants must be currently enrolled full time in an accredited academic institution and have a minimum 2.5 GPA. Two essays and two letters of recommendation are required. Awards: Varies (minimum of \$1,500).

- **United Health Foundation Louis Stokes Scholarship**



The Congressional Black Caucus Foundation's Louis Stokes Health Scholars Program, sponsored by United Health Foundation, seeks to increase the number of qualified, competitive African American or Black students entering internal medicine, family medicine and pediatrics. The multi-year award supports these scholars throughout their undergraduate and graduate academic journey. Qualified applicants must be currently enrolled full time in an accredited academic institution and have a minimum GPA of 3.0. Applicants must be pursuing an undergraduate or graduate degree in a health-related field and be a U.S. citizen or have permanent U.S. residency, and desire a qualifying primary health care profession. Award: Four recipients, \$5,000-\$8,000 continuously for up to 5 years.

- **Ally Financial Law and Public Policy Scholarships**

- ✓ **Ally Financial Law Scholars Program**

- The CBC Foundation's Ally Financial Law Scholars Program, sponsored by Ally Financial, seeks to increase the number of qualified, competitive African American or Black students entering the profession of law. This program offers a scholarship award to offset scholar's cost of attendance. The multi-year award supports students throughout their law school journey.

- ✓ **Ally Financial Public Policy Scholars Program**

- The CBC Foundation's Ally Financial Public Policy Program, sponsored by Ally Financial, awards scholarships to academically talented and highly motivated African American or Black students pursuing an undergraduate degree in public policy or a related discipline including but not limited to political science or public administration.

Sara Scholarship Program for Female Students

The Sara Scholarship is granted annually through the Henry & Sara Sheehan Foundation. This scholarship program is available to female high school seniors who plan to pursue a college degree and who demonstrate academic achievement, excellence of character, financial need and are involved with the sport of golf. Applicants must have a cumulative minimum unweighted GPA of 3.3 and be United States citizens. A personal essay and a letter of recommendation from a high school teacher, counselor, or administrator such as a principal are required. Awards: A minimum of eleven \$2,000 scholarships will be awarded in 2021. The grant is eligible for renewal throughout the applicant's undergraduate college career up to four years, for a total amount of \$8,000.

A personal statement addressing a topic determined by Great Minds in STEM, one peer letter of recommendation and one faculty letter of recommendation are required. Awards: A merit-based scholarship ranging from \$500 to \$5,000, listing in the HENAAC Scholar press release, and transportation support to the 2021 HENAAC Conference, that will be hosted in Pasadena, CA beginning October 7.



Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP) and Financial Assistance Program (FAP)

- **Armed Forces Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP)**

Each year the Air Force awards scholarships through the Armed Forces Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP). It pays for tuition, books, and most fees. The HPSP also gives students a monthly stipend for living expenses while they attend the school of their choice. Students should be U.S. citizens and be attending or planning to attend school at an accredited graduate institution in an appropriate health

professions training program (such as physician, dentist, optometrist, clinical psychologist, nurse, nurse anesthetist or other allied health profession). The best time to apply for a four-year scholarship is the fall before the year the applicant plans to attend professional school. Scholarships are offered for one, two, three, and four-year terms. While on scholarship, the awardee will spend 45 days on active duty in the Air Force, and once they graduate, in exchange for the scholarship, their commitment to the Air Force is to serve active duty (one year for each year of scholarship, with a minimum of three years). Some third- and fourth-year medical students can serve a clerkship at an Air Force medical center. Award: Up to 4 years of tuition (two years for PA master's degree), and additional school costs covered, as well as a monthly stipend.

- **Financial Assistance Program (FAP)**

The Air Force Financial Assistance Program for medical and dental residencies can help the awardee complete their residency. Upon completion of their residency, they will have a one-year obligation for each year of participation, plus one extra year. Awards: awardee will receive more than \$45,000 for every year they participate in the program and receive a stipend of over \$2,000 a month to cover living expenses.

MDC Last Mile Completion Scholarship

Students who left MDC without completing their degrees due to financial hardships can now finish what they started by enrolling in the Last Mile Completion Scholarship Program. Women's Independence Scholarship Program (WISP)

WISP is available nationally to women who have left an abusive domestic situation and who are pursuing an education designed to provide economic independence for themselves and their children. Applicant should be a woman who survived intimate partner abuse and has been separated from their abuser a minimum of one year, but not more than seven, U.S. citizen or permanent legal resident (eligible for FAFSA), who applied to or is officially accepted into an accredited course of study at a United States institution, demonstrates a critical need for financial assistance, exhibits a strong desire and the ability to complete a training and/or academic program and has a definite plan to use the desired training to upgrade skills for career advancement, to train for a new career field, or to enter or reenter the job market and has sought services from a non-profit, domestic violence agency for a minimum of 6 consecutive months (and this agency is willing act as sponsor by mentoring and providing support to the student throughout her educational experience). There is no deadline for applications; however, it takes them about two months to review new submissions.

Iraq and Afghanistan Service Grant

Iraq and Afghanistan Service Grants provide money to college or career school students to help pay their education expenses. The Iraq and Afghanistan Service Grant is awarded to a student whose parent or guardian died because of performing military service in Iraq or Afghanistan after September 11, 2001. The student should be not eligible for a Federal Pell Grant based on Expected Family Contribution but must meet the remaining Federal Pell Grant eligibility requirements. The grant is not based on financial need nor is it considered estimated financial assistance that reduces the amount of any other federal student aid that the student may also qualify for. Applicants should be under 24 years old or should be studying in college at least part-time at the time of the parent's or guardian's death. Award: Contact your Financial Aid Office. For the 2021–21 award year (July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2021), the maximum Federal Pell Grant award will be \$6,345.

TEACH Grant

The U.S. Department of Education's Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education Grant (TEACH Grant) Program provides funds to students who are completing or who plan to complete coursework that is required to begin a career in teaching, and who, in exchange for receiving a TEACH Grant, agree to teach as highly qualified teachers for at least four academic years (within eight calendar years of completing the program of study for which they received the award) in public or private elementary or secondary schools that serves students from low income families. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.25 and be enrolled in an eligible program. Students may receive one or more TEACH Grants to pay for their education. Award: up to \$4,000 annually.
